For Oil Painting

- One small set (at least 12) of oil colors, or water-mixable oils, or acrylics
- One tube of titanium white
- Other colors to add, if you like:
 - Alizarin crimson
 - Cadmium yellow hue
 - Cadmium red hue
 - Cadmium orange hue
 - Dioxazine purple
 - Ultramarine blue
 - Phthalo green
 - Phthalo blue
 - Lamp black
 - Sap Green
 - Payne's Gray

Earth colors

- Burnt sienna
- Burnt umber
- Raw sienna
- Raw umber
- Yellow ochre
- Naples yellow
- Brushes: white nylon flats 1 inch, ½ inch, ¼ inch, at least two of each
- Rags paper towels/handy wipes
- Palette knife
- 1 white charcoal pencil, General's #558 is a good choice.
- 10 small canvas panels or wood or masonite, or heavy watercolor paper 8 x 10, 9 x 12 or 11 x 14 inches, prepared with two thin coats of gesso primed with a toned or gray surface this will be demonstrated if needed. If your canvas is pre-primed white, half your work is done one coat of gray paint is all that is needed.
- Disposable palette or roll of butcher's paper or freezer paper (at grocery store)

Pastel Drawing

- Box of pastels: as large as you can afford 36 colors minimum. The more pastel choices you have the less mixing you have to do. *Prismacolor Nupastel* (now made by Sanford at www.sandfordcorp.com) will be fine. They are available at local art stores. They work well and are less expensive than imports. If you have *Rembrandt*, *Sennelier*, *Schmincke*, *Holbein* or *Daler-Rowney*, bring them but save them for the finishing touches of intense color. Cray Pas or oil pastels are not for this class.
- One white charcoal pencil. General's #558 is a good choice
- Ruler: 12- or 18-inch
- Small sheet of fine sandpaper 200 grit will work
- Five sheets of Canson Mi-Teintes pastel paper, light or dark gray or black, 19 x 25 inches, approximately
- Soft eraser Staedtler (mars plastic), white
- Small roll of tape masking tape OK, but white paper tape is better

- Matte knife.
- A flat surface to work on (wood, Masonite)
- A small hard bristle oil painting brush (e.g. white, boar hair bristle) for removing excess pastel.

Other Supplies

- Any type of lightweight easel for working in the field. A French folding easel is best, but not mandatory.
 The Julian French easel seems to work best.
- Think about bringing small amounts of water, food, sunscreen, insect repellent
- Consider working outside the way you would hiking, fishing, or camping. Travel light but travel right!

For Watercolor

Bring any watercolor materials you already have. The following items are recommended.

Paper:

Single sheets of artist grade watercolor paper and/or a block of watercolor paper. A good suggestion is Arches 140 cold press. **Do not** bring **student grade papers** such as Bienfang, Canson or Strathmore.

Brushes:

Bring what you have. The following are recommended: #3 or #4 round, 7- 12 round or larger, 1 inch flat **Note:** if you are buying new brushes make sure they are indeed watercolor brushes.

Paint:

Bring what you have. Artist grade paints are best. The following is a *suggested* list:

- Lemon Yellow and/or Cadmium Lemon, and/or Cadmium Yellow
- Cadmium Red and/or Permanent Rose/
- Quinacridone Red(permanent Alizarin)
- Dioxazine Violet or Ultramarine Violet
- Ultramarine and/or Cobalt Blue
- Cerulean Blue
- Phthalo Blue or Prussian Blue

- Hooker's Green and/or Chromium Oxide Green, Phthalocyanine Green
- Yellow Ochre
- Raw Sienna and Burnt Sienna
- Raw Umber and Burnt Umber and/or Sepia
- English Red or Venetian Red
- Perylene Maroon
- Zinc White (OPTIONAL)

Note: Due to the expense of these colors, it is not necessary to have all of them. There are also a number of excellent colors that are not on this list that you may bring. **There are also other very popular paints that are not suitable for watercolor painting and will be discussed in this class.**

Other Materials:

- Drawing board (one that will accept staples is best)
- Stapler (any office stapler will do)
- White artist tape (not low tack tape) or masking tape
- Pencils, B,F or 2H
- Kneaded eraser
 - Soft absorbent paper towels
- Palette: palettes of large wells of various shapes recommended. Small palettes that hold little paint and have little space to mix are not recommended
- Liquid masking solution (optional)

^{*} **Note:** Hookers Green and Sepia are compound paint colors made up of two or more pigments. A thorough discussion of paint, pigments and other color options will be given during the class.
