UNDERGRADUATE PORTFOLIO GUIDELINES



Application to the **Foundation and Studio Residency Certificates** requires an art portfolio of **12-15 images of original work**, which will be reviewed for both admission and scholarship consideration. Consider the **following key elements of a successful portfolio**:

TECHNICAL SKILL


Provide examples of observational work, especially drawing. An observational work is any piece that you create while looking at actual subject matter, such as a still-life or portrait. We recommend not using photographs for reference, as it is important to evaluate your ability to render a three-dimensional space.

AMBITION

Ambition can mean a lot of things - experimenting with size, materials, subject matter, etc. Include work made outside of class assignments, and make sure you identify it as such in the description. Your work should tell us about your goals and interests.

CREATIVITY

Your portfolio is just that - yours! Show us the direction you want to take as an artist. Your portfolio should be curious about the world around you and should communicate your point of view. Do not submit fan art or copies.



UPLOADING YOUR WORK

DO:

- Take images that are clear, well lit, and focused on the work
- Crop images to get rid of outside distractors
- Use JPFG format

DON'T:

- Upload screenshots from social media
- Use distorting filters or added text
