### **Historical note**

Walter Inglis Anderson was born in New Orleans in 1903. He studied at PAFA from 1923-28, winning a Cresson Travel Scholarship in 1927. After his trip to Europe he returned to his family's estate in Ocean Springs, Mississippi. He remained in that area until his death in 1965. He devoted his life to a series of watercolors and drawings of plants and animals of the Mississippi Gulf region.

He was the subject of a retrospective in the Pennsylvania Academy's Peale House Gallery in 1985. (See exhibition catalogue for more information. Also see the PAFA Library clipping file.
