

Historical note

Sculptor Charles Grafly (1862-1929) began his career as an apprentice stone cutter in his native Philadelphia at the age of seventeen. A few years later, he studied drawing at the Spring Garden Institute in Philadelphia, and from 1883 through 1888 was enrolled at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. He then studied at the Academie Julian in Paris, winning his earliest recognition in the Paris Salon.

Upon his return, Grafly taught for a short time at Drexel Institute. He was appointed an instructor at the Academy in 1892, a post he held for the remainder of his life. In addition, he had private pupils in the studio of his Massachusetts summer home, and after 1917 was a faculty member of the school of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.

He received many commissions for portrait busts and memorials, and also was known for allegorical figure compositions. Grafly exhibited internationally and was awarded numerous major prizes and honors. The Academy owns twenty examples of the sculptor's work.
