Need to see a doctor? PAFA has a contract with Jefferson Family Medicine Associates (JFMA) where you can see a doctor for free.

Appointments can be scheduled throughout the week and on Saturday mornings, by calling Jefferson Family Medical Associates directly: 215-955-7190.

There is a physician on call 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.

Super important

This is not the ER and this is *not* a walk-in clinic. You have to call to make an appointment.

The Small Print

- Physically seeing the doctor at JFMA is free for PAFA students, assuming that there are no outside lab fees.
- The student (or insurance) is wholly responsible for paying any lab fees (such as blood tests, pap smears, etc), or procedures that must be referred to a specialist.
- The student (or insurance) is responsible for paying for any antibiotics or medications prescribed during the visit.

When you get there

- Present your PAFA I.D. to the receptionist
- Present your insurance information to the receptionist
- Present the blue PAFA form
- Be prepared to fill out some paperwork

No appointment needed.**

Consider going to Jefferson Urgent Care if:

- If you can't get an appointment today at Jefferson Family Medicine Associates
- Your condition can't wait. At the same time, it's not quite something that would take you to the emergency room. For example, you feel sick or you have a minor injury.
- You have a fever, serious cold, or flu symptoms.
- Your injury is minor--a sprain, a minor burn, or you think you might need a few stitches.

Some of the services provided include:

- Vaccinations: flu, tetanus, etc.
- On-site X-rays
- On-site Labs
- Physicals
- Lots more

What do I need to take with me?

- Your PAFA I.D. for the receptionist
- Your insurance card/information
- A co-payment if your insurance has one
- If you are under 18, bring a friend who is over 18 or someone from Student Services
